1. Grading

Students will be evaluated on homework assignments, tests and quizzes.

Tests	70%
Quizzes	20%
Homework/Assignments	10%
Final exam	20% (of overall grade)



The three terms will be weighted cumulatively. The final exam will be worth 20% of the overall mark.

Homework will be collected daily and a random selection of questions will be marked.

2. Student responsibilities

- Be respectful, kind and courteous.
- Complete homework as fully and as best as you can.
- Ask questions or seek out help when you don't understand (well BEFORE a test and not 5 minutes before you write the test!)
- Be open to making mistakes and trying again when you don't get it the first time. 😊

3. Personal devices

Class time is for school work and face-to-face interaction. Personal devices (mobile phones, iPad/tablets, iPods, smart watches, gaming devices, etc) are NOT permitted in class. If brought to class, they must be turned off and placed in the teacher's box for the duration of the class. They will be returned to the student at the end of the class.

4. Calculator

A basic calculator is all that is required. Scientific or graphing calculators are not necessary. iPhones, iPods, smart watches, translators and other devices that have camera or Internet capabilities are not permitted during tests and quizzes.

5. Homework

Practice questions and problems are assigned at the end of most classes. It is very important that students complete them in order to understand the principles explained in class. Homework will be randomly checked. Full marks for homework questions are only given if:

- The question is solved correctly
- Sufficient work is shown that supports the answer

Include your full name/date/block at the top right corner of your homework.

6. Quizzes

Short quizzes are randomly given during the term. Quizzes may or may not be announced. Work needs to be shown in the solution to the questions to receive full credit.

7. Tests

There will be a test on every chapter or major topic. Tests are announced at least a week before their date. No test mark is omitted (all tests count).

When you are absent for a quiz or a test, you will be expected to write it the day you return to math class from your absence.

8. Communicating with the teacher
